Many of the law offenders arrested recently are drug users. The term “drug-related crimes” has been subject to criticism, as it does not define the specific nature or range of such crimes. Crimes that occur as a result of drug use, crimes that emerge as the result of offender’s need to support his/her drug consumption, and crimes that occur as a result of drug trafficking and distribution are all considered “drug-related crimes”. While most drug related crimes can be in one of these categories, some may include more than one classification.

Some studies conducted by non-governmental organizations have shown that addiction can lead to property crimes and robberies. Drug and alcohol abuse are behind higher rates of domestic violence, child abuse and sexual violence. Drug use is more closely linked to robbery and property crime than to violent crimes. Many addicts commit crimes in order to get enough money to buy drugs. In prisons, those convicted of violent crimes are less likely to have used drugs than those convicted to property crimes. Yet, at least a quarter of men who commit crimes of domestic violence also have drug abuse problems. Women who are drug addicts are more likely to be the victims of those abuses.

Drug use and criminal behaviour certainly seem to be correlated. It is more likely for drug users to feel the urge to commit crimes than non-users.
