As you sit down today to write this exam, you all remember the exam periods in your previous schools. The daunting experience of entering the examination hall, finding your desk and taking a seat and then having a blank paper and unknown questions brought to you. The sweaty hand palms and sickness feeling that seemed to have made you forget everything that you had revised over the past few days or weeks. Even though this is usually something that the HR team does, the process can vary from company to company.
